[Problem gambling in adolescents: An examination of the pathways model](#)

Gupta, R., Nower, L., Derevensky, J. L., & Blaszczynski, A. (2009).

Using a sample of 1,133 adolescents from Quebec and Ontario, the present study sought to test the applicability of the Pathways Model proposed by Blaszczynski and Nower (2002) and Nower and Blaszczynski (2004) for adolescent problem gamblers, and if necessary, to refine or modify the model in order to accurately

differentiate among different subtypes of adolescent problem gamblers, to test the applicability of the Pathways Model for adolescents experiencing substance abuse and dependency, in the absence of gambling problems.
